

Bertha Garvey Formento, Class of 1929

Art Fortunato, Bertha's son, sent us a little history of her early life. Bertha was born on a farm outside of Millington, MI in 1913. Her mother died at the age of 27; Bertha was just 6 years old. Apparently it was not considered appropriate at that time for a father to raise a small girl by himself, so Bertha went to live with her mother's sister until the age of 15. She then moved to Dearborn and lived with her father and stepmother and attended Fordson High School. Following graduation, she worked as a school secretary. In 1931 she married Michael Formento. Bertha's graduation ring is on display on the alumni website.

Dana Herrera, Class of 1972
